Nate Oakley Advances as 2015 National Olmsted Scholar Finalist

Last quarter LA+ED nominated LDA Senior <u>Nate Oakley</u> for the prestigious OImsted Scholars Program. Nate was one of six finalists selected by a jury of leaders in the landscape architecture profession. He was awarded \$1000 and the title of "<u>2015 National OImsted Scholar Finalist</u>." The OImsted Scholars Program recognizes the most outstanding students in landscape architecture students and we are very proud of Nate for this achievement.

LA+ED Students Stay Busy with Internships

Several of our students take on exciting internships during the spring and summer months to gain valuable knowledge and work experience. Here are just a few of the internships our students are participating in this year:

Kristi Lin, SED Junior, will be interning at the <u>OImsted Center for Landscape</u> <u>Preservation</u> in Boston. She will help to create cultural landscape inventories and preservation management plans for Acadia National Park and other parks in the Northeast. Nguyen Nguyen, SED Junior, worked with the <u>UC Davis Arboretum</u> to build a sustainable garden. "This internship taught me how to apply what I have learned in class in practical ways.
